Application Guidelines for Research Students Admission in April 2024, October 2024


Those who wish to conduct research on specific specialized matters at the Graduate School of International Cooperation Studies may apply to the Research Student program. Regardless of your nationality, you must meet the following application qualifications and obtain prior approval for your application from the faculty member for whom you wish to receive research guidance.

2. Eligibility for Admission

- (1) Those who have graduated from an accredited Japanese university, or will graduate it by the end of March 31, 2024 [For Admission in April 2024] will graduate it by the end of September 30, 2024 [For Admission in October 2024].
- (2) Those who hold a bachelor's degree according to the provisions of Article 104.4 in the School Education Act (No.26 of 1947),
 - or will obtain one by the end of March 31, 2024 [For Admission in April 2024] will obtain one by the end of September 30, 2024 [For Admission in October 2024].
- (3) Those who have completed 16 years of academic education outside of Japan, or will complete it by the end of March 31, 2024 [For Admission in April 2024] will complete it by the end of September 30, 2024 [For Admission in October 2024].
- (4) Those who have completed 16 years of formal education in foreign countries by taking a correspondence course through a non-Japanese university while residing in Japan, or will complete it by the end of March 31, 2024 [For Admission in April 2024] will complete it by the end of September 30, 2024 [For Admission in October 2024].
- (5) Those who have graduated from a university in Japan that is a recognized university belonging to the system of higher education of a foreign country and is approved by the Japanese Minister of Education, Culture, Sports, Science and Technology (only those who have completed at least 16 years of formal education), or will graduate it by the end of March 31, 2024 [For Admission in April 2024]
 - will graduate it by the end of March 31, 2024 [For Admission in April 2024] will graduate it by the end of September 30, 2024 [For Admission in October 2024].
- (6) Those who have obtained a degree equivalent to a bachelor's degree by attending an overseas university or other overseas school (limited to those whose education and research activities have been evaluated by persons who have been certified by the relevant country's government or a related institution, or have been separately designated by the Japanese Minister of Education, Culture, Sports, Science and Technology as being equivalent to such) and graduated from a program that requires three or more years to complete (including graduating from a program implemented by the relevant overseas school while residing in Japan through distance learning, as well as graduating from a program implemented by an educational facility established with the relevant overseas country's school education system and has received the designation mentioned above).
- (7) Those who have graduated from a post-secondary course of a specialized training college recognized by the Japanese Minister of Education, Culture, Sports, Science and Technology (limited to those who have attended for at least 4 years, and to those who have fulfilled requirements as approved by the Japanese Minister of Education, Culture, Sports, Science and Technology).
- (8) Those who have been approved by the Japanese Minister of Education, Culture, Sports, Science and Technology (Ministry Notice No. 5 of 1953).
- (9) Those who are recognized as possessing an academically ability suitable for graduate studies by GSICS
 - and are at least 22 years of age by March 31, 2024 [For Admission in April 2024] are at least 22 years of age by September 30, 2024 [For Admission in October 2024]

[Payment in Japan] (Japan Post Bank only) Request for a payment slip to the GSICS Academic Affairs Office [Payment from overseas] See page 9, "Application fee payment method." *No overseas remittance check will be accepted.

- ※If the certificates are in a language other than Japanese or English, a Japanese or English translation should be attached.
- *Applicants who have or will have graduated from a university in China, if admitted, must apply for your bachelor's / master's / doctoral degree and transcript provided by China Higher Education Student Information (CHSI) without delay. Details will be communicated to each successful applicant in this category after the admission decision.
- *Applicants who live in Japan must submit a copy of the certificate of residence (must be made within 30 days prior to the date of submission) or an alternative document.
- *If you belong to a company (including public offices), please submit the Job Holder Recognizance form (Form enclosed).

4. Application Process

Admission decisions will be made based on the submitted application.

5. Results

An official letter of the examination result will be sent by post after January 12, 2024 【For Admission in April 2024】

July 5, 2024 [For Admission in October 2024] .

No telephone and email inquiries will be accepted.

6. Registration and Period of Research

Admission will be on April 1 [For Admission in April 2024], 2024 or October 1, 2024 [For Admission in October 2024].

In principle, the period of research is either six months or one year. An extension request may be granted for a maximum period of one year. The maximum period of being a research student in total is two years.

7. Registration and Fees

All entering students are required to register at the GSICS Academic Affairs Office from the middle of March 2024 【For Admission in April 2024】

the middle of September 2024 [For Admission in October 2024] .

For more detailed procedures, we will inform you at the timing of examination result.

8. Additional Information

- (1) Research students are not able to obtain a master's degree nor doctoral degree.
- (2) Incomplete applications will not be accepted.
- (3) Once an application has been accepted, no changes to the information on the application form will be permitted.
- (4) The examination fee already paid will not be refunded for any reason, except in the case of failure to submit the application documents, etc., or in the case of non-acceptance of the application.
- (5) [For Admission in April 2024]

The admission of the applicant who has passed the examination with the expectation of fulfilling the prescribed requirements by March 2024 but failed to fulfill the requirements by March 2024 will be revoked.

[For Admission in October 2024]

The admission of the applicant who has passed the examination with the expectation of fulfilling the prescribed requirements by September 2024 but failed to fulfill the requirements by September 2024 will be revoked.

(6) Admission will be revoked if any irregularities in the submitted documents are found.

9. Control and Prevention of Infectious Diseases

Kobe University has implemented the *Measles and Rubella Registration Policy*, and all newly enrolled Kobe University students must submit one of the following three certificates

- (①, ②, or ③) to prevent a possible outbreak of measles and rubella on campus.
- ① A vaccination certificate to prove that you were inoculated against measles and rubella (twice each after one year of age) . (recommended)
- ② A vaccination certificate to prove that you were inoculated with measles and rubella vaccines each within the last five years (since April 2019).
- ③ An antibody certificate verifying that you have sufficient antibody titer in your blood (refer to the chart next page) to prevent the development of measles and rubella, based on the results of an antibody test performed within the last five years (since April 2019).
- * For ① and ②, it can be a combined vaccine of measles and rubella vaccines (e.g., MR vaccine).

- * For ① and ②, the certificate must be issued by an accredited medical institution, and state the type of vaccine and the date of inoculation.
- * If there is a history of vaccination, please submit ③or receive vaccination and submit ① or ②.
- * For ③, the certificate must specify the measuring method and the measured values of antibody titer in your blood (refer to the next page), and it must satisfy the judging standard listed in the chart. A blood test report sheet itself can be accepted for submission.

If the antibody titer in your blood is insufficient, you must receive the necessary vaccination, and submit either ① or ②.

- * You may submit a combination of ①, ②, and ③ (e.g., ① for measles, and ③ for rubella).
- * If the antibody titer level is below requirements, yet you cannot be inoculated with vaccines for some reason (e.g. illness or body composition), please submit an official document (for example, a certificate issued by the doctor) explaining why.
- <Submission Period and Place of Submission>
- ·All successful undergraduate and graduate applicants enrolling in April:

Please submit at the time of the medical checkup for new students scheduled in April.

·Successful applicants enrolling in October:

Submit the certificate at the medical check-up site for October enrollment.

^{*} Antibody testing is not required if the vaccination history meets the requirements or if additional vaccinations are given.

* Before you visit a medical institution, please make an appointment and confirm that the antibody test and/or the vaccine you need are available at that institution.

When you visit a doctor at a medical institution, make sure you present this guidebook so your doctor can issue the necessary certificate(s). (Please make sure you confirm with your doctor the measuring methods and judging standards when measuring the antibody titer in your blood.)

^{*} Make sure the above methods are followed when the antibody titer is measured in your blood.

^{*} The protective antibody value differs according to the measuring method used. Please note that the judging standards are higher than the usual standards used at medical institutions.

- * Points to Consider when Submitting a Certificate:
 - ① Please bring the original certificate and one set of copies (A4 size).
 - ② If the certificate is written in a language other than Japanese or English, please attach a document that shows either a Japanese or English translation.
