

Additional Requirements for
the Asian Development Bank-Japan Scholarship Program (ADB-JSP)
MASTER'S COURSE
Enrollment for the academic year
beginning in October 2024

In the 2024 academic year, which begins in October, the Graduate School of International Cooperation Studies at Kobe University will accept Master's Program students sponsored by the ADB-Japan Scholarship Program. Doctoral students are ineligible for this program.

In addition to the requirements outlined in the applicant guidelines, "SPECIAL COURSE FOR DEVELOPMENT POLICY (MASTER'S COURSE)", ADB-JSP applicants should comply with the following requirements:

Eligibility: Scholarships in Asia and the Pacific | Asian Development Bank (adb.org)

- Be a national of an ADB borrowing member country and Japanese Official Development Assistance scholarship eligible country
- Not hold dual citizenship of any developed country
- Have gained admission to an approved master's course at a Designated Institution
- Hold a bachelor's degree or its equivalent with superior academic record. Those with a bachelor's degree but less than 16 years of formal education must verify their eligibility with the Academic Affairs Office (GSICS) by 1 December 2023
- Have at least two years of full-time professional working experience after obtaining a bachelor's degree at the time of application. The candidate must have proficiency in oral and written English communication skills to be able to pursue studies
- Not more than 35 years old at the time of application
- Should agree to return and work in his/her home country for at least two years after completion of studies under the program in order to contribute to its development
- Not be an executive director, alternate director, management staff and consultant of ADB, or the close relatives of the aforementioned by blood or adoption with the term "close relative" defined as: spouse, mother, stepmother, father, stepfather, sister, stepsister, brother, stepbrother, son, daughter, aunt, uncle, niece, or nephew
- Not be staff of ADB-JSP Designated Institutions
- Not be living or working in a country other than his/her home country
- Not be already enrolled in graduate degree programs

Application (in addition to Master's Course):

- ADB-JSP Information Sheet (form attached)
- Certificates verifying your own income and that of your parents or family. Please submit authorized certificates issued by public agencies.

If incomes are not clearly certified, the applicant may not be considered for the scholarship.

If you have no income, attach an official statement or certificate.

If status is unemployed, retired or deceased, an authenticated supporting document must be submitted.

If certificates are shown in local currency, convert in USD and submit the form, "Income Conversion to USD Form".

- Application fee JPY 30,000

Successful applicants will be notified by the GSICS Academic Affairs in early April 2024 and must pay this fee by 10 April 2024. No payment will be considered as withdrawal from the ADB-JSP and the Special Course for Development Policy.

If you have questions regarding any of the above, please contact the GSICS Academic Affairs Office by 1 December 2023.

When initiating the application process, ADB-JSP applicants must inform the Academic Affairs Office of their prospective academic advisor's name.

Deadline:

All required documents must reach the following address between 5 January and 12 January 2024. We accept those documents only by registered mail.

Procedure:

The final scholarship award results are decided by ADB-JSP.

Coverage:

- Tuition fees
- Admission fees
- Medical/accident insurance,
- Monthly stipend 147,000 yen (subject to change),
- Books and research allowances

- Miscellaneous expenses,
- Economy-class airfare via the most direct route from the Kansai International Airport (KIX) / the Osaka International Airport (Itami / ITM) / the Kobe Airport (UKB) to the scholar's home country.

Note that two years is the maximum scholarship length.

Japanese Language Proficiency:

Although applicants are not required to be proficient in Japanese to be admitted, the ability to communicate in Japanese is helpful in daily lives.
